CHILD CARE CENTER'S MISSION

STATEMENT

The mission of The Child Care Center is to serve as a support to the students attending Southwest Tennessee Community College, as well as faculty, staff, and parents from the community. The center provides a well-supervised program for six-week-old to 5-year-old children. We provide a warm, secure environment that encourages parental involvement, and meets the cognitive, physical, social, and emotional needs of children from various socioeconomic backgrounds. Campus child care is a fun place where emphasis is placed on learning through play and developmentally appropriate practices are used.



PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Campus Child Care Centers are designed to provide multicultural experiences in an open-space setting. The open-space concept embraces all areas in the child's environment created by the centers facilities. The staff nurtures the child's sense of independence and encourages exploration and the making of choices. The open-education concept is based on the belief that children learn and grow at different rates, they are eager and curious about learning, and they best learn when they are able to pursue their interests. The emphasis in an open classroom is on the integration of the total curriculum, rather than separate subject matter. Academic reading skills, writing, and number concepts are part of all learning. The child's play is very important. It encourages children to explore, manipulate and construct; and classroom space encourages this. Learning centers are set up throughout the room. Each child can select where and with whom they want to spend their time.

STAFFING

A degreed teacher supervises each learning center. The staffing is as follows:

- Lead Teacher – bachelor's degree
- Child Care Aides – associate degree/high school diploma/GED/CDA certificate
- Senior Aides – high school diploma
- Foster Grandparents – GED/high school diploma

The lead teacher and child care aides are responsible for planning learning activities for the children. In addition to their work with children, the lead teachers are responsible for supervision of practical experiences, of field experience and practical students in the General and Early Childhood Department. In all cases, it is the lead teacher who is ultimately in charge and who bears the responsibility for the area and the assistant's work. In addition, the center employs work-study students as assistants. These students attend classes at the College and are working on a degree in education or a related field. They help prepare classroom materials, assist with the supervision of the children during outside time and rest time, and assist with clerical work in the office.



The Director has a bachelor's degree in Child Development and a master's degree in Child Care Administration. She supervises the total Campus Child Care program. Her responsibilities include curriculum development, budget management, in-service training, and development of the parent-education program. Each center has an assistant director and parent coordinator who assist the director in overall center operations and parent-involvement strategies.

The Campus Child Care centers are divided into five functional areas:

1. Infant Class (Macon Cove Only)
2. Toddler Classroom
3. Two-Year Old Classroom
4. Barn/Open Center (3,4,5 years old)
5. Pre-Kindergarten (Macon Cove Only)

The Campus Child Care Center offers: computers, math, science, language arts, manipulatives, library, dramatic play, music, blocks, and art.
