Recommended Databases

• <u>Gale Literature</u>

A database that cross-searches all the Gale literature-based databases simultaneously. Includes original works, commentary, reviews, biographies, literary criticisms, summaries, author information, etc.

• Lit Finder

A Gale database with full-text online primary sources (poetry, short stories, essays, and plays) written by popular authors throughout history. It also includes some secondary materials (biographies, photos, etc.).

- <u>Literary Reference Center</u> A database that contains full-text online books written by popular authors. It also included secondary works, such as author biographies, literary analyses, and work summaries.
- <u>Literature Criticism Online</u>
 A Gale database of literary commentary and analysis, including scholarly and popular opinions.
- <u>Literature Resource Center</u>
 A Gale database containing literary reviews, commentary, overviews, biographies, and criticism of popular authors and works.
- <u>Books and Authors (Gale)</u> A database that contains book reviews and bibliographic information as well as author profiles with lists of their works and biographical information.
- Oxford Encyclopedia of American Literature
 An online reference work that can be browsed or searched for background information on American authors and literary works.

 NOTE: The library also has the Oxford Encyclopedias of <u>British Literature</u> and <u>Children's Literature</u> available online.
- International Encyclopedia of Linguistics (Oxford) An online reference work that can be browsed or searched for background information on linguistics, development of language, and different forms of language.
- Gale OneFile: Informe Académico

A database that contains resources for Spanish-speaking users. It has full-text entries from Spanish and Portuguese journals and magazines.

• The Literature Network

An open access database featuring popular literary works in a full-text online format. It can be browse or searched by title or author, and it also contains summaries, quotes, and quizzes.

• <u>CliffsNotes</u>

A website containing summaries and analyses of popular literary works, character analyses, author bibliographies, study guides, practice exercises, and easy-to-read Shakespeare translations into modern English.

• <u>SparkNotes</u>

A website containing study guides for popular literary works, including summaries, character analysis, quotes, main ideas, and no-fear translations of more difficult works to read (such as Shakespeare).

• <u>SpanishDict.com</u>

A website that translates Spanish and offers guides for users to practice grammar, translation, vocabulary, pronunciation, and conjugation.
