## **CORONAVIRUS UPDATE**

## Two Southwest students notified of coronavirus exposure; College taking precautions

The Shelby County Health Department (SCHD) Sunday March 8 confirmed the first case of coronavirus in Shelby County. The patient is being treated at Baptist Memorial Hospital-Memphis. Earlier today, the SCHD notified two of our radiologic technology students that they were exposed to the patient at Baptist Memorial Hospital - Memphis and instructed them to not return to their clinical rotations and classes until March 18, which is 14 days after their exposure to the patient.

The two students attended classes Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of last week in the Allied Health Building, prior to the exposure notification. Therefore, out of an abundance of caution, the College instructed radiologic technology students in both of the exposed students' cohorts via a virtual meeting this evening to not return to classes until March 18. While the risk of their exposure to the virus is low, the College's Custodial Services Department will take this opportunity to perform a deep cleaning of the Allied Health Building, paying particular attention to the radiologic technology classrooms, laboratories and equipment. This deep cleaning will comply with guidelines set forth by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

All classes held in the Allied Health Building ONLY are canceled and will resume March 18. All other Southwest students are to return to classes March 16 as previously scheduled.

The coronavirus situation is fluid. Therefore, Southwest officials are meeting throughout the day to follow developments and to coordinate the response according to the College's Emergency Response Plan, which includes a Pandemic Response Plan.
